Global Learning Objectives for Entire Program:

In the area of hematopathology, participants will be able to classify anemia based on morphologic and pathogenetic features; utilize clinical, morphologic and molecular data to diagnose specific chronic myeloproliferative neoplasm; recognize morphologic, immunophenotypic and molecular features of benign lymphadenopathies.

In the area of Dermatopathology, participants will be able to compare and contrast antigen targets for "classic" melanocytic markers with newer markers; review the most common dermatitides affecting the vulva; list types of lesions from scrotal skin routinely received.

In the area of GI Pathology, participants will be able to describe key histologic features of acute and chronic hepatitis; list distinguishing characteristics of ulcerative colitis and Crohn's disease and recognize conditions that can mimic inflammatory bowel disease.

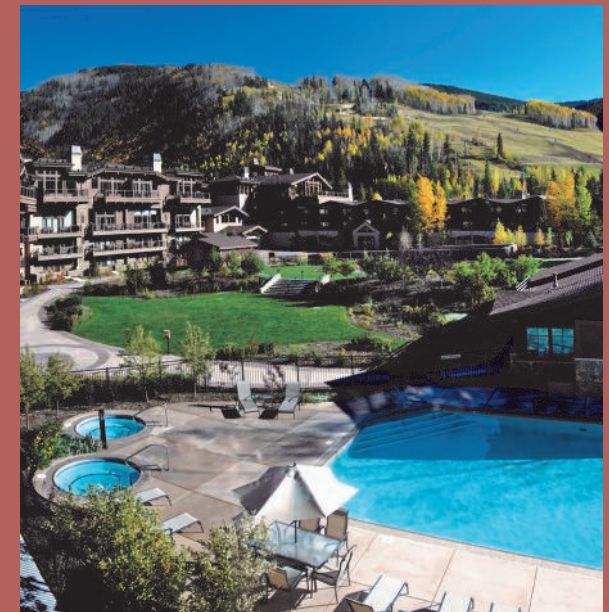
